The following is not a resolution, but simply a summation contained within one page. The Resolutions and Platform Committee will be moving for the Central Committee to take the following positions on the November 2018 Ballot Measures:

OPPOSE State Ballot Measure 102 – Allow Municipal Bond Revenue to Fund Privately Owned Affordable Housing

OPPOSE State Ballot Measure 103 – Ban Tax on Groceries

OPPOSE State Ballot Measure 104 – Definition of Raising Revenue for Three-Fifths Vote Requirement

OPPOSE State Ballot Measure 105 – Repeal Sanctuary State Law

OPPOSE State Ballot Measure 106 – Ban Public Funds for Abortion

BLANK Metro Ballot Measure 26-199 – Bonds to Fund Affordable Housing

For Metro Ballot Measure 26-199, the Resolutions and Platform Committee is not recommending a specific position, but feels the Central Committee should take a position on the ballot measure.
