 - Second Reading - 2020-016 – Forest Management and Taxation-After discussion Dean Moberg moved amend the motion to strike 3 and add “We support the audit of the Oregon Forest Resources Institute (OFRI), as requested by Governor Kate Brown’s office, with particular attention to allegations that OFRI has engaged in lobbying and public relationship on behalf of the timber industry”. The motion to amend was discussed. The motion to amend carried 34-6 The main resolution as amended was adopted without further discussion. 41-2
 - Second Reading-Law Enforcement Accountability-The resolution was approved 41-1
- Rules – **Garrett Fleenor-reported upcoming work on rules**

11. Continuing & New Business

- Opposition to the Basalt Creek Bridge-The resolution passed after discussion 44-1
- Lisa Stiller-Gun Safety-Gerritt Rosenthal moved to amend the motion to take out “we support similar legislation in the Oregon legislature (HB 2543)” the amendment passed 36-4. The motion as amended passed without further discussion 40-0
- Martita - Made a motion “ Whereas Nafisa Fai is a newly elected Washington County Commissioner and ran on platforms of public safety, housing and transportation.
- Whereas Nafisa Fai is a diverse representative, specifically a woman of color, who can increase the understanding around the needs of underrepresented communities.
- Whereas the Washington County Democrats support equity and inclusive representation in all matters of local government.
- Therefore, the Washington County Democrats support realignment in committee representation that will select Nafisa Fai to represent Washington County on the following committees:
 - - The Joint Policy Advisory Committee on Transportation (JPACT),
 - - The Washington County Coordinating Committee (WCCC), and the
 - - ODOT Region 1 ACT (Area Committee on Transportation)” supporting Commissioner Nafisa Fai’s Committee assignments Lisa Stiller made an amendment to add the housing committee, after discussion the ammended motion failed. 6-28
- The original motion passed without discussion. 36-0
- Karen Packer-moved to increase the contribution to the Beaverton School Board-Veronica moved that refer the matter to increase the money to Beaverton school district to committee and report back, passed 32-0.
