Article 1: Civil Rights and our Civic Environment

Washington County Democrats believe all persons have the right to: adequate healthy food, secure housing, quality behavioral and physical health care, clean air and water, freedom from servitude, freedom of movement and belief, freedom of speech, quality education, personal security, equal treatment under the law, opportunities to succeed, marriage to whomever they choose, and death with dignity. Oregon is a mosaic of different cultures and we value the economic, social, and cultural benefits to society from various indigenous and immigrant groups. We reject xenophobic scare tactics, religious litmus tests, and ethnically disparaging racial rhetoric. Both documented and undocumented residents have civil rights that we defend.

1. We reject and condemn all ideologies that perpetuate discrimination, inequality, and hate. We oppose racism, misogyny, ableism, ageism, homophobia, transphobia, xenophobia, antisemitism, Islamophobia, white supremacy, fascism, and other ideologies that undermine equity, social well-being, freedom, and safety.
2. We believe institutional racism can and must be eliminated through anti-racism work at all levels of society.
3. We support the use of governmental funds and services to promote human rights and human welfare, protect the environment, and promote civil society based on the rule of law.
4. We support Oregon's legal sanctuary state status.
5. We oppose the use of facial recognition software in policing, government services, and public spaces.
6. We support local public safety measures aimed at reducing injustices in all communities in Washington County, especially marginalized communities
7. We affirm the right of all workers, public and private, to organize, free of intimidation and coercion, for collective bargaining for fair work rules and hiring practices, living wages, just cause protection of employment, and safe working conditions.
8. We support Oregon's Automatic Voter Registration and Vote by Mail system.
9. We believe in a progressive tax structure and transparent and responsible spending policies that promote the common good.
10. We support the civil conduct of all meetings and protection of all public officials who encounter threats, bullying, or interference with their appointed duties.
11. We believe that corporations are not people and money is not speech.
12. We believe that our public defenders deserve a livable wage and a reasonable caseload.
13. We support the movement to reform cash bail and make pretrial incarceration decisions based on risk rather than financial means.

14. We support a policing system based on community support and cultural awareness, a prosecutorial system based on equitable access to the court system, and a detention system with an emphasis on corrective actions and compensation for victims.

Article 2: Environment, Climate Change, and Housing

Washington County Democrats believe that society thrives when all people are able to live safely, comfortably, and with dignity. We believe in the deeply interconnected nature of the Housing and Climate crises, and seek solutions that address both. We recognize that long-term land use planning, sustainable infrastructure, and wise protection of our natural resources are critical for sustainability and livability in Oregon and Washington County. We therefore believe that local, state, and federal governments should play a large and aggressive role in protecting the quality of our environment.

1. We support public sector involvement in promoting housing first policies and expansion of supportive services for solving the houseless crisis
2. We support mixed use development planned to create viable local communities with multiple services and where alternative (non-auto) modes of travel are encouraged.
3. We recognize the importance of Oregon's agricultural, forestry, and fisheries sectors and support sustainable management of natural resources, especially with respect to carbon sequestration, climate adaptation, and wildlife habitat.
4. We support the management of forests and the wildland-urban interface to reduce the occurrence and impact of wildfires.
5. We oppose large-scale conversions of public lands to private ownership and support the protection of local, state, and federally designated parks, wilderness areas, resource areas, and recreation areas.
6. We believe that changes to Oregon land use laws and their implementation should primarily be based on the conservation of farm, forest, and natural resource lands.
7. We recognize the value of dark skies at night both for wildlife and humans and we support reductions in light pollution and noise pollution in urban, rural, and wilderness areas.
8. We support the phasing out of fossil fuel powered vehicles and devices at the earliest opportunity, and oppose the expansion of fossil fuel infrastructure.
9. We support locally grown food and the increased adoption of plant-based diets.
10. We support expanding investment in safe, equitable intercity and local public transportation services, rail and bus, to all corners of our county and beyond, connecting urban and rural areas.
11. We believe that when considering financial support for our transportation, including roads and transit, regional and community equity should be high priority.
12. We support the provision of broadband services to all communities in the county and throughout Oregon.

Article 3: Education and Human Development

Washington County Democrats value and demand equity-based, sound, effective, and fully funded public education for pre-K, K-12, post-secondary, and career and vocational training be made available to all. We recognize that quality education increases our economic well being, promotes civic engagement, enriches personal lives, and is necessary to adapt to changes. Public schools provide the skills and knowledge that are the foundation of a thriving democracy. Every person deserves a quality education.

1. We believe basic education and career training at public schools, colleges, and universities should be tuition-free for all Oregon residents.
2. We believe public funding for K-12 education should be provided only to public schools.
3. We support a comprehensive public education curriculum that includes science, mathematics, social studies, the humanities, the arts, physical education, economics, and career education; lessons and materials should be fact based and age appropriate.
4. We support funding of K-12 education to achieve the Quality Education Model (QEM)
5. We believe that teachers and staff should be paid a livable wage.
6. We support public funding to ensure that quality childcare is accessible and affordable, in particular from birth to age five.
7. We believe quality education requires a diverse teaching staff of all races, ages, genders, and beliefs trained in current best practices and compensated sufficiently to recruit and retain effective professionals.
8. We recognize that we need solutions for workplace displacement caused by transitioning to new technologies, including off of fossil fuels or displacement due to automation and artificial intelligence.
9. We support adequate public funding for public and school libraries, including access to scientific and technical journals and historical and sociological analyses.
10. We oppose the banning of books
11. We believe educational programs must accommodate student needs including those of second language learners, students who experience neurodiversity, and talented and gifted students. We support providing equitable opportunities, access, and available resources, as required by the Individuals with Disabilities in Education Act and the Americans with Disabilities Act.
12. We oppose legacy admission preferences at colleges and universities.

Article 4: Healthcare and Human Welfare

Washington County Democrats believe that healthcare is a basic right and should be available to all those who need it. We believe that modern medical advancements related to disease prevention and treatment of pathologies, including holistic treatments, must be available to all people regardless of ability to pay.

1. We oppose the death penalty.
2. We support measures that increase gun safety and reduce gun violence.
3. We support Healthcare for All.
4. We support the provision of Wrap Around Services for people in need around the State and County.
5. We believe that all situations of employment should provide a livable wage, paid sick leave, and paid family leave
6. We support the expansion of Abortion Services, Reproductive Health Services, Gender Affirming Care, and legal protections for those either providing such services or seeking out that care.
7. We support public health mandates, and require that all businesses and local governments comply with such mandates arising from a declared public health crisis.
8. We believe that all people should have access to adequate and affordable housing and health services.
9. We believe misinformation is a serious threat to public health as it can cause confusion, sow mistrust, harm people's health, and undermine public health efforts.
